The 5 Senses—from “Color Outside the Lines” -Part 2 By Howard Hendricks

Last week, we talked about these senses:

1. SIGHT
2. HEARING
3. TASTE

This week we continue with...

4. TOUCH—How vital “touch” is in today’s world! A simple handshake from an old friend...a warm embrace, a hug...or even a light pat on the shoulder...each one conveys a feeling unlike any other. It just...feels good! In nature, the elements of cool water, warm sunshine, and bitter wind remind us of the importance of this sense. Notice how frequently Jesus

touched people as He healed them. It is a proven fact that new-born babies who are touched, held and comforted thrive better than those who are left alone.

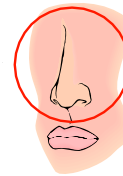
5. SMELL—Finally, the one sense that finds hardly any use in our worship experience...smell! In biblical settings, this sense is almost always combined with other. Examples:

- * the taste in Passover & Lord’s Supper
- * the touch of the bread and wine
- * aged and blind Isaac identified his sons...by their smell and touching their hairy arms
- * the woman who bathed

Jesus’ feet with perfume utilized the sense of smell and the visual of the perfume covering His feet. “...the more we use all five senses, the greater the learning and...the more permanent the retention.”
